Syllabus for Basic Referee Training

Candidate

Attends Course Introduction – Module 1

- Takes the 'Assessment of Knowledge' paper
- DVD promoting refereeing / sell the benefits / Support Mechanisms
- Completes a Criminal Records Bureau Disclosure Form (where appropriate)



Candidate

Attends Safeguarding Children Workshop - (at some time during the course)



Candidate

Completes all Modules of the Basic Referee Training Course – Module 2
Misconduct form completed from a match incident from the theory exam DVD



Examination – Module 3

- Practical (where applicable)
- Theory exam (approximately 2 modules from the end of the course - where applicable)
- Written exam at the end



To become a qualified referee (Level 7 or 8, depending on age)



Match Experience – Module 4

- Referees 6 games - 11 v 11 (recommended 2 or more to be mentored)



Next Step Workshop – Module 5

- Attend a 2 / 3 hour workshop
- If successful, receives an FA Certificate of Qualification



If successful Candidate will now be registered as a Level 8 or 7
